Reputedly once a gentleman's clab, this property was built in the 1840s as part of the mini boom Notting Hill experienced back then. In the late 1980s it was converted to seven flats, and this mateometic was subsequently purchased by the current owners in 1995. Their main requirement was to find a property with as much light as possible. Lackily the light here is speciacular, thanks mainly to the double supect combined with extremely generous high critings and windows.

In 2007, Stephen Pletcher Architects were appointed to completely renovate the property. The owners loved the clean lines and unfury degence of the firm's portfolio, and the fact that its beapoke style creates homes for living in, rather than simply admiring. The owners currently work from home, something which is possible due to how quiet the property is. "At times, my husband and I have both been home-based. We can each have an office downstate and use the upstates for meetings or lunch breaks, together or on our own."

The owner's also describe the communal garden that the property has access to, as one of the nicest in Noting Hill – they often go there to pienic, read the Sanday papers or simply meander. Sounds perfect to us.
